Ato Isayas Afewerki Abraha Hagos Mirach, WoldeKidan #1 Photo (left) and Dejezmatch Solomon Abraha Hagos Mirach, WoldeKidan #2 Photo (right) are rulers who are related by royal blood, each on has his own separate domain. I would skip Pr. Isayas's domain, as it's obvious to everyone. Haile Selassie I, Emperor of Ethiopia, appointed Dejezmatch Solomon Abraha as Enderasie to Wollo Province in 1971. He stayed in that post until his death in the fateful Black November, the most dreaded day in the annals of Ethiopia: November 23, 1974.

Dejezmatch Kahsay Mirach (ደደዝማች ካሕሳይ ምራጭ) is great grand-granduncle of President Isayas Afewerki Abraha. Dejezmatch Kahsay Mirach is also the great granduncle of Dejezmatch Solomon Abraha Hagos. Ras Alula Engda Uqbin (ራችሲ አሉሳ እንግዳ ዑቅቢን) or Aba Nega (አባ ነጋ) also known as Wedi Uqbin (ወዲ ዑቅቢን) is the greatest general and genius military tactician under Yohannes IV. He had the Battle of Gundet (1875) . . . Battle of Gurae (1876) . . . Battle of the Kufit (1885) . . . Battle of Dogoli (1887) . . . Battle of Metema (1889) . . . Adwa (1896) under his belt. Except Metema, five aces are to the General.

Ras Hogos Mirach WoldeKidan, Shum of Tembien is also the veteran of Gundet, Gurae, Metema and Adwa but his greatest asset is, he is the brother of King Yohannes IV (Kahsay Mirach). As brother of Yohannes IV that means he commands an considerable army.

The two old rivals met at Shire, Tigary and fought an bloody battle on January 19, 1897. The Five Aces General won the critical battle but at an hefty toll, the General himself was badly wounded to the leg. Shum of Tembien, Ras Hagos is also wounded in the battle.

In the battle, the victor wounded Five Aces General captured the wounded Ras Hagos. The General hanged the wounded Ras Hagos on the spot.

The Five Aces General died from his wound on February 15, 1897, exactly 27 days after Ras Hagos. The death of the two titans brought the demise of Tigray House of Lords that benefited Menelik II.

The Late Ras Hagos Mirach WoldeKidan is the grandfather of Dejezmatch Solomon Abraha Hagos Mirach and also the grand-grandfather of Isayas Afewerki Abraha Hagos Mirach.

RAS ALULA DEAD.

An Abyssinian General of Great Ability—The Son of Peasants.


ROME, Feb. 26.—Reports received here announce the death of the great Abyssinian chief, Ras Alula.

Ras Alula was fifty-five years old. His parents were peasants in the village of Punake, near Mekalie. He served for several years as groom to the uncle of the Negus, Ras Area. He entered the service of Ras Area, whose daughter he married, and later he became Master of the Wardrobe at Court. After the death of his father-in-law, he was promoted to the rank of Chamberlain, and then he was made Governor of Tigre, with the title of Ras.

Ras Alula developed great military skill, and for many years was regarded as one of the greatest of Abyssinian Generals.
