FAKERY BY O3

PHOTO - 1: The men with their hands raised up don't appear Ethiopian army POWs. Most likely these men are captured TPLF POWs.

1. GREEN ARROWS on PHOTO - 1 denote coloured Shedas, which TPLF combatants used to wear them during the rebellion years. See green Sheda in PHOTO - 2.

2. RED ARROW on PHOTO - 1 denotes a squeezed Netsela or sheet (ዝተጠምጠም 5%ሳ), which is hung from the man's neck and left shoulder.

Squeezing Netsela and storing it around the body was fashionable by all TPLF or EPLF combatants.

See the red arrow denoting the squeezed Netsela in PHOTO - 1.

PHOTO - 3 below, was the image, which was shared by Alena Walta Hager in the Facebook. On this image, the man with the red circle around his head is also seen with coloured Sheda.

O3 machinery of fakery has deliberately defaced the photo with blue coloured Geez text and an imoji in order to hide the coloured Sheda of the man in the forefront of the photo.

PHOTO - 4 below, was the image, which was shared by Aregai Hagos in the Facebook. The image is severely doctored by O3 fakery technicians.

- 1. YELLOW TINT: The original black and white photo is treated with yellow tint. The yellow tint was purposely applied to the photo in order to match the brown colour of the face of Brigadier General Kasaye Chemeda and the colour of the photo, which originally was black and white colour. See the brown coloured face of B. G. Kasaye and the yellow tint in PHOTO - 4.
- 2. REDUCTION OF RESOLUTION: The original high-resolution photo is deliberately degraded to low-resolution image in order to mask the crude doctoring activities on the photo.
- 3. The face of Brigadier General Kasaye Chemeda is superimposed on the face of the man in the forefront of the photo. See PHOTO - 5.

Conclusion

From my investigation, I conclusively declare, the man in the forefront of the photo is not Brigadier General Kasaye Chemeda. The veteran highly decorated ex-Brigadier General Kasaye Chemeda was never captured by EPLF in Eritrea.

Also I acknowledge, the bunch of prisoners in PHOTO - 6 are most likely TPLF POWs. It's impossible for me to determine at this time, who captured the bunch,

TPLF combatants? Or in which place were they captured? Anyone with valid information about the captivity of the TPLF combatants is invited to come forward and inform our public.

The medias shared in the Facebook by various O3 and spies of Isayas are heavily doctored photos designed to misinform the Eritrean public.

All O3 scams and Isayas's spies shall be exposed.
